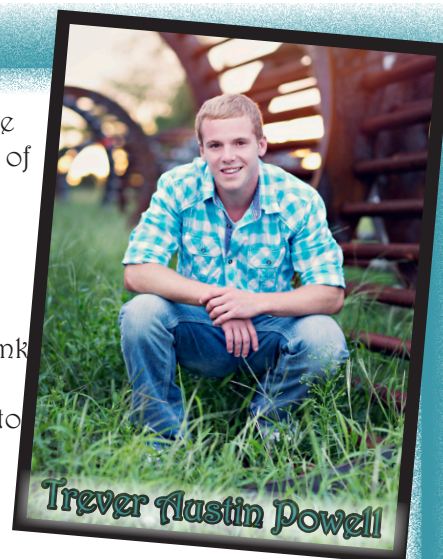


Trever is the son of Travis and Heather Powell

The WHOLE football season is Michael's favorite memory of high school. Michael will be playing football at Sterling College, majoring in Athletic Training.

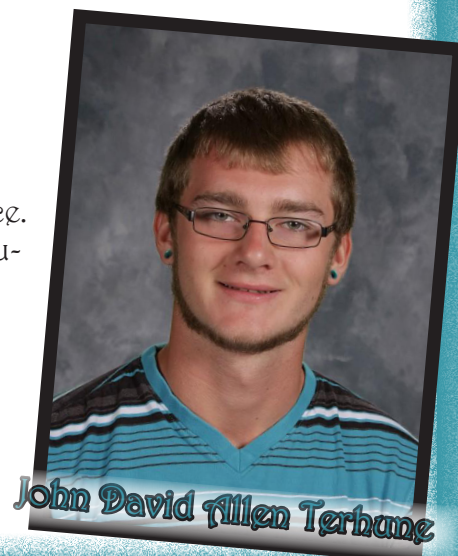

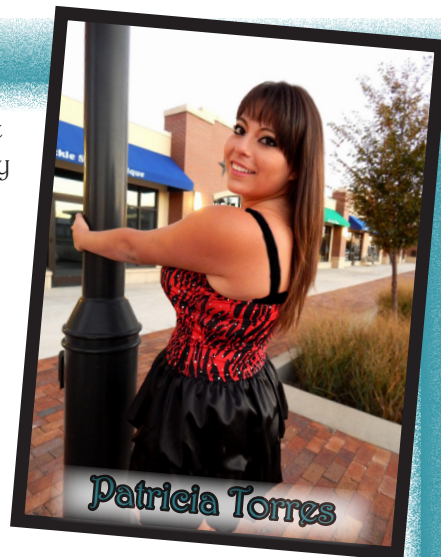
Corbin is the son of Randy and Logan Vandenthoek

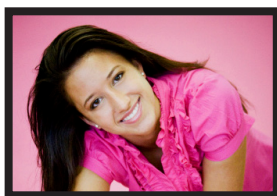

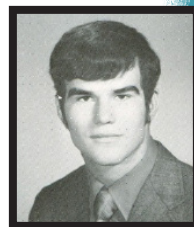
