Math

Algebra

Eighth grade Algebra I students spent December learning about functions. They learned several new vocabulary terms when it comes to working with functions. Students can tell you the domain and range of a function and they can tell whether the function is discrete or continuous. We also worked with graphing linear functions and special functions called piecewise functions. When we return from Christmas Break we will begin working with exponents and exponential equations and functions.

8th Grade Math

Students in 8th grade math have been working with linear equations. We have spent time learning different ways to use an equation to create a graph. Students have also worked with looking at a graph and writing the linear equation to match it. These are skills that are important for upcoming lessons and when they continue into Algebra I in high school. When we return from Christmas Break, we will begin working on solving systems of equations. This chapter will encompass many of the skills we have covered in previous chapters and put them altogether. Hopefully, students will begin to realize all of the connections between the different skills we have been learning.



7th Grade Math

One group of 7th grade students has finished a unit on solving inequalities. When we return from Christmas Break, this group will begin working on ratios, rates, and proportions. The second group of 7th grade math students has just wrapped up the unit on percents. Students have been working to gain understanding of discounts and markups. They also learned how to figure simple interest. When we return from Christmas Break, they will start working on some geometry concepts.

English Language Arts
