On the 19th of September, the city of Greensburg unveiled the time capsule from the year 2000. The capsule was originally placed inside the Big Well's walls back in the day, and it took around four hours to dig it out. When unloaded, the contents were unveiled for the community. A picture of the graduating class of Greensburg High School, a cheerleader's uniform with the GHS Ranger's red and royal blue colors, a paper with all of the popular games during that time, as well as a copy of the Kiowa County Signal, and a paper that showed the cost of school lunches were among some of the treasures inside.

The current events class and the publications team worked together and made a "2025 Year in Review" pamphlet. Students highlighted the major events in 2025, like the cost of living, places to eat in Greensburg, the change from the Rangers to the Mavericks, and the sports that we play for the school. They also wrote about the 2007 Greensburg tornado and highlighted school achievements as well as programs like JAG, FFA, and forensics. The combined current events and publications group hopes that their contributions will help the future generations understand what life in 2025 was like.

Since the 2000s, we have gone through many changes-like the destruction of the Greensburg tornado, the COVID pandemic and the advancements of technology. For example, we have gone from CDs to streaming services, from the Nokia with limited technology to iPhones.

The Kiowa County School district also donated the KC on the lettermans jacket and a bandana with the KC Mavericks logo. It will be interesting to see in 25 years if the logo and mascot look the same or if there will be changes. Only time will tell.





